From North 101

Take Samoa/Sunny Brae exit, then take second right and go over freeway.

You are now on Samoa Blvd. You will pass the Hwy. Patrol office and go through a Roundabout. At the next Roundabout, you will turn left on Buttermilk. The Sunny Brae Animal Clinic and the shopping center are on the left. Follow Buttermilk past the school. When the road bends to the right, start looking for 2840. There will be five black mailboxes on a redwood stand. Also, look for a HWS Sign. You will turn left up our driveway just past the mailboxes. We are a few driveways BEFORE the Golf course.

Follow the driveway to the end. You will pass four houses, then you'll come to an open gate. Go through the gate and park on the circular driveway.

From the South on 101

Take the first Arcata exit and go towards Sunny Brae.

Blvd. See above for the rest of the directions.

Stay right and you'll be on Samoa From Old Arcata road (coming from Eureka). Turn east on Buttermilk at the Follow Buttermilk to 2840 (Five Black mailboxes)

Above is a layout tool to mark patterns or curved lines. It consists of multiple strips of thin plywood secured at one end and then clamped in place to make pattern. The jig to the right is used with a router to make loose tenons.

THE VIRTUES OF FOREMAN TAPE

We always called it foreman tape when I worked in a machine shop because it reminded us of our foreman (two faced). Whether you call it carpet tape, double back tape, or foreman tape it comes in really handy in a wood shop. If you don't have some, I suggest you purchase a roll. It can be used to temporarily assemble components of a project to see how the parts fit together or how it looks assembled without permanently gluing it. I use it to secure sandpaper to special shapes for sanding in hard to sand areas. It is also helpful to use it to make temporary fixtures to aid in machining wood parts. When you don't have enough hands to hold parts together while you nail or drill them a piece of foreman tape might just do the trick. If you have some available I am sure you will find other uses for it.

BUILD YOUR OWN LOCOMOTIVE

If at least five people are interested in building one of my locomotives I would be willing to write a monthly article on the progression of fabrication and assembly. At least five people would have to buy a set of plans. The group could work together to share tools and expertise.
